Message from the President

Dear Supporter,

I would like to begin by thanking you all for continuously supporting our work at Human Relief Foundation. During the past year we have been able to help thousands of vulnerable men, women and children across the world.

Throughout 2014, the world continued to face a number of civil wars and cross nation conflicts, as well as ongoing poverty. Human Relief Foundation did everything we could to reach those in need.

In Syria, thousands continue to flee the country, looking to neighbouring countries for safety. As a charity, we continued to feed thousands of people every month.

During Ramadan 2014, a violent conflict began in Gaza. It was a conflict that would go on to kill thousands of people, almost five hundred of who were children. During this period, Human Relief Foundation helped provide medical supplies to the Al-Shifaa hospital on the Gaza strip, so that they could treat the wounded.

In Iraq, people from all across the country have now become internally displaced. In September 2014, I personally assisted with the distribution of air coolers to those who had violence and were living out in the open. This equipment helped many people get through the scorching summer, and it was good for me to see the wonderful relief work Human Relief Foundation operates.

Outside of our humanitarian news, in 2014 we successfully organised and executed our first international deployment. In December, we took eight volunteers and three staff members to Jordan, where they helped to distribute aid to Syrian refugees and had the chance to listen to their stories first hand. During their trip, they met a very poor family with two disabled children. The story they heard inspired them so much that, the same night, they appealed to family and friends from their hotel room and raised over £10,000 to assist with medical bills for the children.

This year, Human Relief Foundation has helped people in some of the most poverty stricken areas of the world. With your help, we have been able to provide medical aid and emergency food and water to as many people as we can reach. We will continue to support as many people as we can.

As well as this, HRF continue to work with the UN-Habitat, the United Nations Development Programme, the World Health Organisation and the World food Programme, all of whom are assisting us in our work in Somalia, Pakistan, Palestine, Syria, Jordan, Sudan and Iraq.

We hope very much that you enjoy reading about our work. I ask you to please continue to support us. Your contribution is invaluable.

Message from the Chairman

In 2014, millions of people continued to suffer across the world.

In Africa, drought and famine continues to face millions. In the Middle East, war and poverty is ongoing. As a result, large portions of the world society are suffering and vulnerable. Often, these people rely on international aid organisations like Human Relief Foundation to provide them with emergency food, water, shelter and medical supplies.

Throughout 2014, Human Relief Foundation has worked tirelessly to help as many vulnerable people as possible. In 2014 alone, we distributed food to over 700,000 Syrian refugees. As well as this, our Qurbani and Ramadan project helped provide food for thousands of poverty stricken people.

In the UK, our Woolly Winter Appeal helped keep homeless people on the streets of Britain warm. We forged a wonderful partnership with

Intouch Foundation, a UK based homeless charity who provide hot food to those living on the street. Alongside them, Human Relief Foundation provided hats gloves and scarves to people who spend their nights in the cold.

Without your help and support, we would not be able to conduct any of our work. Thousands of you donated and helped us build water wells and sponsor orphans. Without this, we would not be able to implement any of our projects.

IRAQ

People fleeing conflict in Iraq

Casualty figures in Iraq in 2014 were the highest they had been in five years as a result of a violence that spread across the country. More than 12,300 people were killed. Due to difficulties in verifying figures, the United Nations warned that this figure needed to be regarded as the absolute minimum.

Our Work in Iraq

In 2014, Human Relief Foundation helped 60,000 people caught in emergency situations, from flooding to conflict.

Through our emergency response teams based in Mosul and Baghdad, Human Relief Foundation distributed thousands of blankets and mattresses to flood victims in the early part of the year.

Later, in the summer of 2014 when fighting erupted across the country, Human Relief Foundation travelled to the borders, where families were stranded in temporary accommodation. The heat was insufferable, especially for children and the elderly. Human Relief Foundation distributed emergency food items and air coolers to hundreds of families.

As well as our emergency response activity, Human Relief Foundation continued to support orphans around the country, and gave long term financial aid to 80 distinguished students, so that they can continue their studies and work their way out of poverty.

SYRIA

People fleeing violence in Syria

The year 2014 witnessed the three year anniversary of the start of the Syria conflict. Still, the conflict raged on. Approximately 220,000 people have lost their lives in ongoing war. Over 11,000 children had already lost their lives in the conflict by early 2014. Thousands of people every day were pouring into neighbouring countries throughout the year.

Our Work with Syrians

Human Relief Foundation has been working to alleviate hunger suffering amongst Syrians since the start of the conflict in 2011. In 2014, we fed over 700,000 people in partnership with the World Food Programme, in a project that allowed Syrian refugees in Jordan to exchange vouchers for essential food and non-food items.

In the winter months, Human Relief Foundation travelled to refugee camps and gave out hundreds of thick blankets and mats, so that those sleeping on the floor were less likely to contract hypothermia.

HRF also embarked on vaccinating over a thousand children against the most common life threatening illnesses, including polio and the flu, and put them back into school.

Human Relief Foundation is committed to helping Syrian refugees as much as we can. We are currently appealing for funding to assist with renting properties for the homeless.

SOMALIA



Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in Somalia

Somalia is ranked third for global mortality rate and first in the category of 'war deaths', as well as last for availability of suitable drinking water. Over a million people are internally displaced within the country due to conflict. Two million people are classed as 'persons of concern', meaning that they are at risk from death or illness due to poverty.

Our Work in Somalia

Human Relief Foundation continued to operate the Solid and Liquid Waste Management Programme in partnership with the United Nations Human Settlement Programme (UN-Habitat).

The project, which has been active for over two years, uses a variety of methods to improve hygiene and sanitary living in camps for internally displaced persons.

We train local communities on how best to keep themselves and the areas in which they live safe and germ free.

Poor people in Sudan

Two rounds of civil war between the North and the South of Sudan have killed 1.5 million people. Additionally, over two million people have been driven from their homes in Darfur due to ongoing tensions. There is a high risk of illness and disease in Urban areas, where medical treatment is not easily available.

Our Work in Sudan

In Sudan, Human Relief Foundation operates a number of clinics across the country. Alongside our partners the World Health Organisation (WHO), we assisted 76,000 people in matters of primary healthcare in the areas of Al-Riyadh, Abuzar and Terbaba.

A huge part of our work here involved reproductive healthcare for new mothers, where Human Relief Foundation delivers around 29 babies per month. That is almost one a day.

In the dry season, Human Relief Foundation assists Sudanese communities by handing out food to vulnerable families, mainly in female led households. Hundreds of people benefitted from this feeding project throughout the year.

PAKISTAN



People living in poverty in Pakistan

Despite the constitution of Pakistan ruling that every child in the country is entitled to free education, 25 million boys and girls under 16 are not in school. Over half of Pakistan's population are living under the poverty line, meaning they survive off less than two dollars a day.

Our Work in Pakistan

Human Relief Foundation sponsored orphans all across the country, to make sure their food, accommodation and water was taken care of. We installed hand pumps to provide fresh water to over 16,000 people. We distributed emergency food and water to those living through intense heat and poverty. At the HRF Isakhel hospital, dozens of babies were delivered, cataracts and eye corrective operation were performed for 27,000 people so that they can see the wonder of the world again, and primary health care was provided. Human Relief Foundation also helped dozens of children living in poverty go back to school.

GAZA

Those affected by conflict in Gaza

A 50 day war in 2014 left 2,200 people dead and 20,000 homes destroyed. Half a million people were displaced by the conflict. More than 300,000 of those were left seeking shelter in schools and derelict buildings.

Our Work in Gaza

During conflict in 2014, Human Relief Foundation responded by supplying the Al Shifaa Hospital with emergency aid and supplies. We appealed for donations of £25, so that we could give emergency packs of anaesthetic, surgical equipment and painkillers.

Enough surgical packs were provided to help thousands of people in severe pain and fear.

After the conflict, we set about repairing the homes of those who were bombed in the conflict. Our current ongoing projects are looking to restore dozens of homes.

Human Relief Foundation enjoy the support of volunteers to raise funds for our humanitarian campaigns. In 2014, volunteers raised an incredible £23,000 in one day, which was donated to give medical equipment to treat injured people at the Al Shifaa Hospital in Gaza.

ORPHANS

Global Orphans

Over 153 million children around the world are orphans. Most of them reside in Asia, which is home to over 60 million children who have lost their parents. There are various causes of death resulting in orphans including wars, conflicts, epidemics and natural disasters.

In 2014, we attained sponsorship for 640 orphans. Across the world, 2,865 children have been sponsored by Human Relief Foundation donors.

JORDAN DEPLOYMENT

Our First International Deployment

In December 2014, Human Relief Foundation launched its first international deployment. A group of volunteers from up and down the country travelled to Jordan, where they spent six days distributing aid to Syrian refugees.

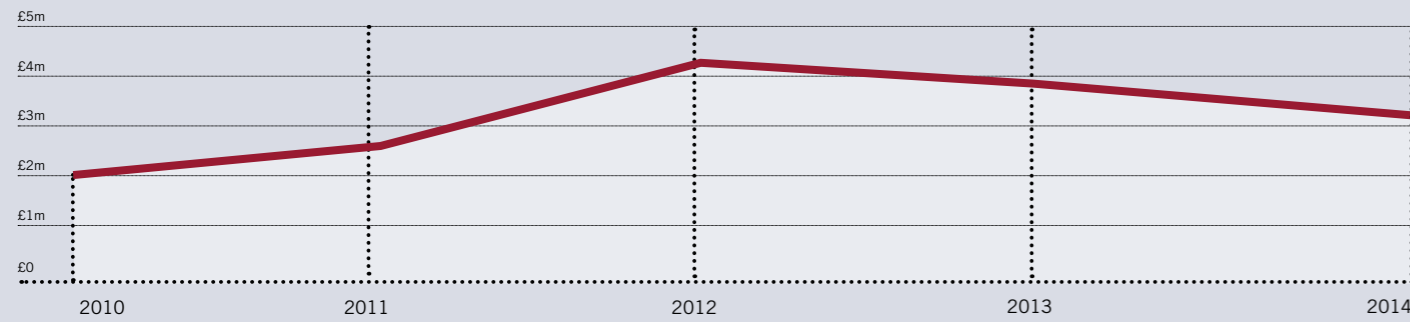

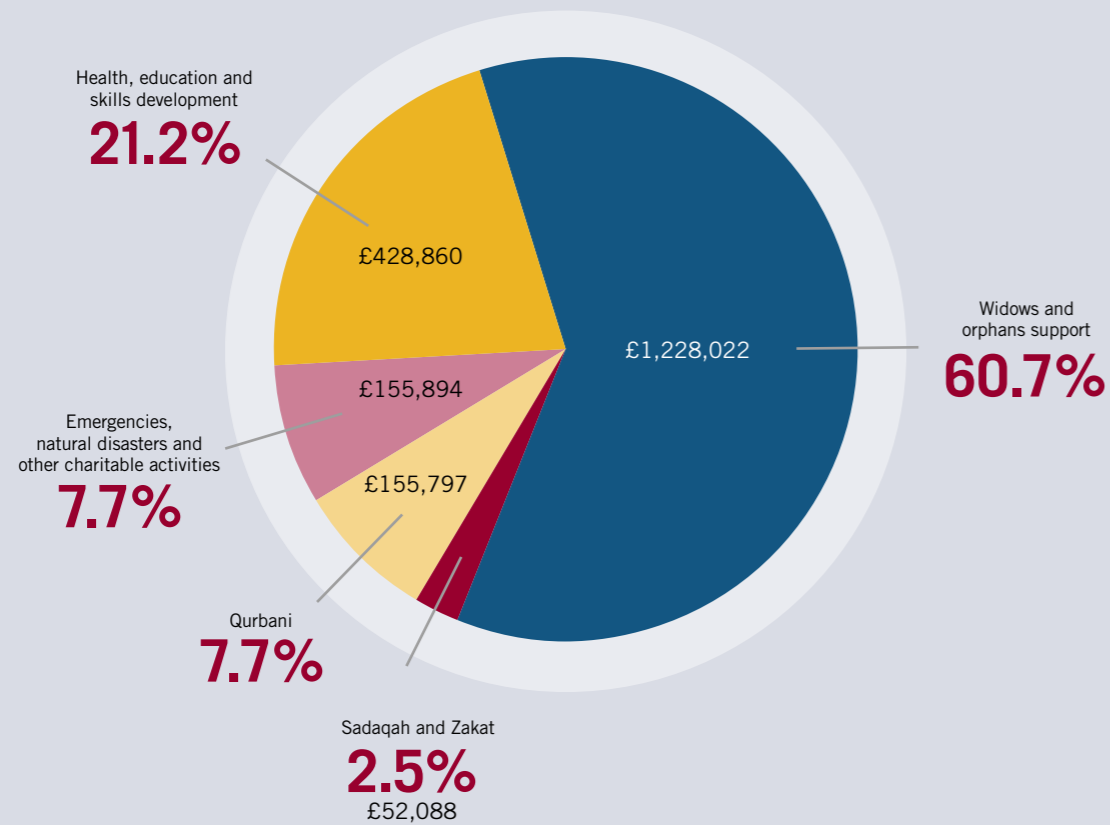
